# Consultation on Proposed Food Safety Bill

On behalf of the Hong Kong College of Community Medicine (the College), I would like to submit our comments on the proposed Food Safety Bill.

As a professional organisation consisting of specialist doctors working to improve the health of the community, the College welcomes and supports the proposal on formulation of a Food Safety Bill which is a positive move to tighten up the control of food safety and better protect the health of people in Hong Kong.

Food safety is a very important public health subject as well as an issue with great consumer interest. However, it is noted that there are gaps and problems in the existing regulatory framework which hinder prompt introduction of stringent control measure to tackle food problems effectively. The food incidents in recent years have exposed inadequacies of the current food law which needs urgent revamp. We would also like to provide comments on specific areas of the proposal as follows:

# Definition of Food

The proposal to broaden the definition of "food" to cover live fish, live amphibian as well as ice is agreeable. However, other items which could be taken as food e.g. other live animals or live birds, but are not caught by the existing food law should also be included.

# Mandatory Registration Scheme of Food Importers and Distributors

The College considers it acceptable to require mandatory registration of food importers and distributors which is a common practice in most overseas

It is especially important and relevant to Hong Kong which very much relies on imported food. President **Record Keeping** Dr Kathleen So 蘇碧嫺 The Colleges considers that it would be useful to require record keeping by the trade to facilitate tracing of problematic food. However, it is important to Vice-President have a system in place to monitor and validate the proper record keeping. Dr S P Mak 麥倩屏 Specific Import Control The College agrees with the proposed strengthening of import control by Chief Censor requiring more food to be subjected to tightened regulation according to their Dr T H Leung risk level. To strike a balance, it is considered appropriate to adopt an 梁挺雄 incremental approach by controlling food with high potential health risk initially while reserving power for the authority to extend control measures to other food types should there be change in circumstances. Honorary Secretary Dr Thomas Chung Prohibition of Import and Sale and Food Recall 鍾偉雄 The College agrees that the authority be empowered to prohibit the import or Honorary Treasurer sale of, and order a mandatory recall of problematic food if there are Dr S V Lo reasonable grounds to believe that the food concerned poses a serious health 羅思偉 hazard to the public, which could facilitate prompt intervention to better protect the public. Members Food Safety Appeals Board Dr Fung Hong 馮康 The College considers it reasonable to set up a Food Safety Appeals Board. Dr Mandy Ho However, the procedures and arrangement should not undermine the prompt 何孟儀 implementation of public health intervention.

Local Primary Production

The College considers it sensible to introduce similar control measures to local primary produce. However, there should be clear delineation of enforcement authorities to ensure that the local primary produce are subject to the same strengthened control and meet the same level of safety standards.

Last but not the least, there should be sufficient sanction in the legislation to deter violation of statutory regulation.

The College considers the overall proposal reasonable and in the right

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direction. We look forward to seeing more details of the regulatory framework under the Food Safety Bill soon.
