	Post Forum Optional Tours	
Option 1: Surrey Memorial Hospital, Vancouver - Half Day Program, 3 June 2013		
Location	Vancouver, BC, Canada. This educational tour will include transport to Surrey Memorial Hospital in Vancouver for a visit commencing 11 am and finishing around 2:00 pm. Partipants will meet at the Hyatt Regency and travel together to the venue.	
Objectives	A Case Study visit to Surrey Memorial Hospital to explore first hand the role of leadership in transforming a community hospital to one with a significant academic campus. Learn about the Canadian healthcare system at the same time.	

Location	This educational tour will include bus transfer from Vancouver, BC to Seattle, Washington, USA departing early Monday morning with an optional bus transfer return to Vancouver Tuesday evening with accommodation and meals in Seattle Monday night. Delegates can either return to Vancouver or stay in Seattle if they choose. For the latter, no return transfer will be arranged. The distance by road is 226km with approximate travel time of 3hrs including possible border crossing delays.
Objectives	Study examples of large-scale organisations operating within regulatory environments that can be compared to, and applied in, the delegates own work environment. Learn about efficient process design and innovative cultures in non-healthcare industries.
