A clinician of one participating centre commented, "At least 1 out of 10 patients in my clinic with their fasting triglyceride reading lower than the lower bound of the 95% confidence interval, there must be something wrong with the survey results."
 - (a) Regarding the clinician's statement "At least 1 out of 10 patients in my clinic with their fasting triglyceride reading....", use statistical term to describe what the underlined refers to?

(b) According to the statistical theory, what form of distribution is the sample mean of a study variable assumed to follow? Is it necessarily the same in the underlying population?
